BREAKING GROUND: CHINESE AMERICAN ARCHITECTS IN LOS ANGELES (1945-1980)

showcases the achievements of four pioneering Chinese American architects whose contributions were critical to the development of Los Angeles' urban and visual landscape between 1945 and 1980. The exhibit focuses on the lives and work of **Eugene Kinn Choy**, **Gilbert L. Leong**, **Helen Liu Fong**, and **Gin D. Wong, FAIA**, four architects who played pivotal roles in the development of Mid-Century Modern and Googie Architecture movements, unique to California's Post-War architectural renaissance.

Breaking Ground is part of Pacific Standard Time. This unprecedented collaboration, initiated by The Getty Foundation, brings together more than sixty cultural institutions from across Southern California for six months beginning October 2011 to tell the story of the birth of the L.A. art scene. Pacific Standard Time is an initiative of the Getty. The presenting sponsor is Bank of America.

本展覽將首度展出1945至1980年間，對洛杉磯市區及視覺景觀建設發展具有關鍵影響及卓越貢獻之四位華裔美籍建築師。此次首展主要聚焦於蔡文仲、梁恩霖、劉彩屏、與黃振捷四位建築大師的生活動態與工作紀錄。他們的建築風格以及對於加州地區二十世紀中期與戰後的Googie現代風格建築影響甚巨。
